

BY - LAWS
of the
FAIRWAY CLUB

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Adopted June 12, 1919

Revised to February 1, 1937

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1. The name of this organization shall be the Fairway Club.
2. Its objects are to promote sociability and to provide opportunities for its members to enjoy the game of golf at various courses.
3. Membership shall consist of the sixteen charter members whose names are appended hereto, and others who may be subsequently elected as hereinafter provided, to a total number of not over thirty-six members.
4. The Club shall, from time to time, hold golf matches at various golf courses to be selected by the Executive Committee. Notice of the time, place, etc. shall be sent to each member at least one week ahead of time.
5. In case of unsettled weather on the day appointed for any match, the Executive Committee will decide before noon whether the match will be played or postponed. Members are requested to telephone the Secretary for instructions as to the Committee's decision. In case it is decided by the Committee to hold the match, it will be considered official in spite of how the weather may turn out, provided four or more full scores are turned in.
6. Notice of time and place of postponed matches shall be sent to all members immediately after failure to hold any regular match.

7. Special matches and trips may be arranged from time to time by the Committee, but the results of same shall have no bearing on the award of the Club prizes hereinafter listed.
8. Business meetings shall be held at least once a year; a majority shall constitute a quorum. Time and place to be determined by the Committee, and due notice given all members.
9. The business and affairs of this Club shall be controlled as provided by these By-Laws by an Executive Committee of five members, elected annually by the Club.
10. The Executive Committee will select one of its members for each of the following offices: President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.
11. The President (or in his absence, the Vice-President) shall preside at all meetings of the Club or the Executive Committee.
12. The Secretary shall have charge of sending out all notices and keeping the records of matches and all business transacted. An annual report shall be sent to all members.
13. The Treasurer shall have charge of collecting, holding and disbursing all dues and other funds, of which accurate accounts are to be kept and an annual report presented to the Club.
14. The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the President, Vice-President or Secretary. It shall have power to fill vacancies in any office or in its own ranks. A majority shall constitute a quorum.
15. (a) The Executive Committee shall have power to elect new members to the Club.
(b) Applications for admittance of new members must be made in writing to the Secretary.
(c) In addition to such a letter from the Proposer, two other letters of recommendation from members will be required before the application

is considered complete. The Committee should be advised, among other things, as to whether the applicant can be expected to attend regularly.

(d) Applicants for membership must have played as a guest at a regular match of the Fairway Club before their applications will be considered, and must be personally known to a majority of the Membership Committee. One or more negative votes will prevent admission.

16. Any member not playing in at least one-half the regular matches during the season will be automatically dropped from the membership list, exceptions in special cases being allowed at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

17. The Executive Committee shall act as handicap committee and award handicaps, based upon the previous performance of each member. The Galkins System is to be followed as a guide, using the five best scores made by each member during the last two years.

18. A member is to be especially appointed by the Executive Committee to take charge of the arrangements for each match, including procuring permission for the use of the course, locker accommodations, caddies, paying greens fees, etc.

19. Dues shall be fixed by the Executive Committee, and shall be sufficient to cover the cost of prizes, greens fees, and miscellaneous expenses. Caddy fees will be paid by each member at time of match.

20. Suitable trophies and prizes will be purchased under the direction of the Executive Committee, and awarded according to these By-Laws and other rules which may be adopted by the Executive Committee.

21. These By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of all the members of this Club, voting either at a stated meeting or by letter, provided that notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to all members at least one week previous to taking such vote

PLAYING RULES

1. In match play, handicaps used shall be equal to three-quarters of the difference between the handicaps of the two players. Fractions of one-half or over shall count as whole strokes.

2. Balls played out of bounds or lost balls may be played over without penalty except the counting of the stroke already played; or ball may be dropped as near as possible to the place where boundary was crossed or ball lost under penalty of one stroke.

EXAMPLE:- Drive out of bounds, tee up and play two or drop near boundary and play three.

3. Balls in unplayable lies within bounds may be lifted under penalty of two strokes.

4. No stymies shall be played without lifting.

5. Balls embedded in soil of putting green only may be lifted, and mud adhering to balls on putting green may be removed.

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RULES FOR AWARD OF PRIZES

1. MEDAL HANDICAP CHAMPIONSHIP

At each regular match the member making the low net score is declared the winner. At the end of the season, the Fairway Club Cup will be awarded to the member having won the most matches during the season. In case of low net score ties in regular matches, the two or more members tying shall each be credited with a win, but ties for the Championship shall be played off.

2. MATCH PLAY PRIZE

The members shall be paired and notified by the Secretary in advance of each regular match, and each pair is to make its own arrangements for getting together

and if possible combining with another pair to make a foursome. Pairings shall as far as possible be made so that no two members will play each other twice in any one season.

Any member who expects to be over one half hour late, or who is unable to be present at a match, should notify his opponent so that another match may be arranged. No matches will be considered as won by default and substitute pairings shall constitute official matches.

The winner of the most matches during the regular season shall receive the Match Play Prize. Ties count one half to each. If the season should end with a tie for first place, the match play championship shall be decided at a special subsequent match.

3. "POINTS" PRIZE

Members playing in regular matches shall be awarded "points", as follows:-

Low Gross	3 Points	Low Net	3 Points
2nd Low Gross	2 "	2nd Low Net	2 "
3rd Low Gross	1 "	3rd Low Net	1 "
Match Play Winners	2 "	"Syndicates"	1 "

No one man is entitled to points for both gross and net scores for the same match but may take the highest. In case of tie in gross and net scores, each party shall receive the same number of points as if he had won the place without tie. Points for match play are awarded for games actually played, no wins by default being counted. The member scoring the most points for the season shall be the winner.

4. LOW GROSS AVERAGE PRIZE

To be awarded at the end of the season to the member who, having played in at least six regular matches, has made the best gross average for the year (in regular matches only).

5. LOW NET AVERAGE PRIZE

To be awarded at the end of the season to the member who, having played in at least six regular matches, has made the best net average for the year (in regular matches only).

6. A prize shall be awarded to the member making the best improvement in gross score average from the preceding year, provided he has played six matches each year.

7. Prizes are intended to be valued in the order listed above, and no member is eligible for more than one prize.
